Entertainment books make great gifts and are available for purchase at the low price of \$25.



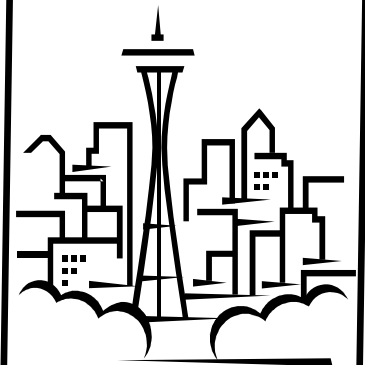

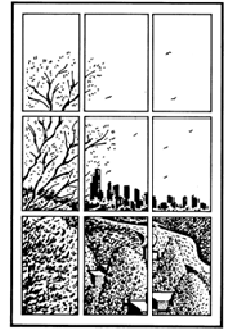
Recycle...and Support FCS!

Did you know that you can recycle used cell phones (including extra cell phone batteries), used inkjet cartridges, PDA's, and laptop computers at Fairview? According to recent surveys, on average Americans replace their cell phones every 12 months. We have a collection box for items in the main hallway. A couple of times a year, we send them to a company called EcoPhones. EcoPhones (www.ecophones.com) pays us for each item that we recycle. This is a great way to keep our environment from being polluted and help FCS at the same time.

As I cast my vote last week and made preparations for our Veteran's Day assembly, I was reminded once again of the wonderful privileges and tremendous freedoms we enjoy as United States citizens. We are truly blessed to live in a nation where we are free to make our beliefs known as we cast our vote on Election Day. But this freedom has come at a great cost.

This morning, as we honored our veteran's I realized how important it is that we remind our children often of the freedoms we have. As I spoke to the children, I told them of the great privilege we have to assemble, even as we were at the time, without

fear of being taken captive. I shared with them how fortunate they were to be able to attend a Christian school and learn the things from God's word.

But, as important as these freedoms are, there is a freedom that is even more precious. That is the freedom we can enjoy in Christ. The price that has been paid for our national freedoms has been great, but the price that Christ paid for our spiritual freedom was even greater. Mr. Reitz, the speaker at our assembly today and Mrs. Lehman's father, did a wonderful job of reminding our students of what it meant to be a Christian. He related how the Lord had used him during
