



Palm Sunday. Waving palm branches. Exclamations of praise. Cleansing the Temple. Preaching. The Last Supper. Washing feet. Communion. Prayer. Betrayal. Trial. Denial. Crucifixion. Burial.

Holy Week. As I listed the events I began to wonder - what makes it holy? The word holy means sacred, set apart, worthy of praise. So just what makes this week holy? Then I began to wonder, what caused the crowds to change from "Hail Him! Hail Him!" to "Nail Him!"?

As I thought about that the last few days, I was struck once again with the expectations of the people. What did they expect when He rode into their city and they hailed Him "King of the Jews"? I believe they simply wanted a Savior. But, I think they wanted a different kind of savior than what Jesus was and is. They wanted a savior to end their earthly oppression. He was a Savior to end spiritual oppression. They

wanted a savior that would show the world they were the chosen ones and the rest were outcasts. He became the Savior of all, and anyone can become part of the Chosen. They wanted a savior that would set up an earthly kingdom where they would "rule the world". He ushered in the Kingdom of God, and He rules in the hearts of those who accept him as Savior. They did not want the kind of Savior He was and is. They wanted THEIR kind of savior. In their disappointment and selfishness they turned on Him and demanded His death.

But the list of Holy Week events does not stop with His burial. Holy Week has one more wonderful event. The Resurrection of our Savior! I believe that all the events of this last week of Jesus' life are sacred and worthy of praise, but it is this last event that truly makes the week Holy. If the Resurrection had not

taken place, the other events would have eventually been forgotten. Without the Resurrection, we all would still be looking for a savior. The glorious news is that the Resurrection **did** happen and because it did, Jesus is the Savior.

I have several more questions. What kind of savior are you looking for? Are you looking for a savior that YOU want? Or are you willing to accept the kind of Savior Jesus is? Will you be disappointed as those of old were and turn away from Jesus? Or will you accept what He has to offer, what he purchased with His death and what He sealed with His Resurrection?

My final thought on what makes this week holy is that we make it holy. Each of us who walks with Jesus through the week, gladly accepting what He offers, makes it holy.

Holy Week Events at Fairview


Holy Week is a very special time in the life of the Christian church. Fairview Church would like to cordially invite you to attend some special events planned to remember and commemorate Christ's last week prior to His death and resurrection.

Maudy Thursday, April 21: Service of Communion and Foot-Washing. We will gather in the Auditorium at 6p for a light meal, worship and communion and then separate (men and women) and follow the example of Jesus in practicing the ordinance of foot-washing.

Good Friday, April 22: Tenebrae Service. We will gather for this unique candlelight service at 7:30p in the Auditorium. Tenebrae is a quiet service retelling the story of Jesus from creation to crucifixion through scripture, singing and communion.

Easter Sunday Sunrise Service, April 24: Come and celebrate the resurrection at the Green Lake Aqua Theatre. Service will begin at 6:30a and will be followed by a family breakfast at Fairview at 7:30a.

Easter Worship Service, April 24: Join us for worship service at 10:30a, featuring dramatic presentation, special music, hand bell choir and Bible message.
